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Homeless Crisis Response Program

- Grants to provide homeless prevention services and emergency shelters and housing resources.
 - Services include rental assistance, utility deposits, and moving people or families to permanent housing.
- Available to nonprofit organizations, local governments and public housing authorities that serve the housing needs of homeless people and people facing homelessness.

Supportive Housing Program

- Grants to reduce homelessness in Ohio and provide funding for transitional and permanent supportive housing.
 - Transitional housing can be provided in one structure or several structures at one site or in multiple structures at various sites.
- Available to nonprofit organizations, local governments, and public housing authorities that provide transitional housing to homeless families and permanent supportive housing for homeless disabled persons.
 - Services are available to households at or below 35 percent of the area median income.

Housing Assistance Grant Program

- Grants to enable homeowners at or below 50 percent of median income to stay in their homes by providing emergency home repairs and renovations for handicap accessibility.
- Available to nonprofit agencies that contract with local qualified construction companies to complete home repairs and renovations.

Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS

- Grants to assist with meeting the housing and supportive service needs of low- and moderate-income people with AIDS or HIV-related diseases.
 - Services include tenant-based rental assistance, short-term rent, mortgage and utility assistance.
- Available to nonprofit organizations to assist with meeting the housing and supportive service needs of low- and moderate-income people with AIDS or HIV-related diseases.
